WHY IS SORTING RECYCLING SO IMPORTANT?

NO GLASS NO PLASTIC BAGS NO PLASTIC CUPS NO SMALL PLASTICS. LIDS, OR, UTENCILS NO COFFEE CUPS NO PIZZA BOXES NO FOOD OR FOO D CONTAINORS **NO WAXBOARD* NO STYROFOAM**

Avoid recycling these items even if you think are recyclable. Contaminated materials can cause recycling to be landfilled.

*Waxboard: Cardboard coated with wax - juice boxes, milk cartons, etc **ARE NOT RECYCLEABLE**

DO NOT RECYCLE ANYTHING OTHER THAN THE MATERIALS LISTED ABOVE.

Contamination jeopardizes the safety of Material Recovery Facility (MRF) Workers.

Recycling is mostly sorted by hand.

Contaminants (needles, diapers, glass, batteries) can release dangerous fumes and endanger MRF workers. Materials like hoses, plastic bags, and clothing can get stuck in the machines. Turning machines on and off to unclog them is dangerous and can cause serious injury.

Contamination is EXPENSIVE. Recycling facilities normally operate at a loss.

Contaminants reduce the quality and price of recycled products. MRFs must pay to have trash, which can be around 25-30% of collections, sorted and hauled, Contaminants delay the recycling process leading to longer workdays and more overhead spending.

Contamination lowers recycling rates. **Recycling facilities are closing** everywhere.

Contaminated recycling often has to be thrown away. Without enough clean recycling, MRFs shut down due to low profits. Contamination is one of the main reasons China stopped accepting recycling from certain countries, leading to lower recycling rates globally.

Recycling bins are located in almost 30 buildings on campus.



Look out for cardboard-only recycling receptacles in the lobbies of each Res Hall .

Cardboard must be broken-down, plastic free, and clean! No pizza boxes.

Only recycle clean, food/grease free materials. Avoid throwing away small plastics and keep tops on water bottles. Please break down cardboard.


